Associate Pastor for Spiritual Formation and Administration

The Associate Pastor for Spiritual Formation and Administration is a full-time position that will collaborate with the Senior Pastor, staff, church committees, and ministry directors in providing Spirit-led leadership that engages all generations toward growing in Christlikeness. There are four primary areas within the church through which the Associate Pastor will seek to accomplish this: Christian Education, Discipleship, Missions, and Administration.

This role requires substantial organizational and discipleship gifts to develop influential ministry leaders and teams.

Preferred Qualifications:

- A clear sense of calling to vocational ministry.
- A degree from an accredited seminary.
- Minimum of 3 years of experience working in the local church.
- Exceptional organizational and relational skills.

Ministry Responsibilities

Christian-Education

- o Recruit, equip, and encourage leaders for adult Sunday School classes.
- Assist Sunday School teachers in choosing the curriculum. Ensure literature and all necessary teaching aids are available for teachers.
- Lead our Starting Point class for those new to FBC MHC.

Discipleship

- Actively engage in disciple-making through teaching and personal relationships.
- Recruit, equip, and encourage lay leaders in various discipleship roles within the church, including:
 - Wednesday Night Discipleship Studies
 - The Associate Pastor will lead a fall, spring, and summer discipleship study.
 - Oversee WMU & Baptist Men ministries

Missions

- Work in conjunction with the Mission Committee toward Missional Engagement in our community and abroad
- Participate in Vacation Bible School
- Lead outreach events
- Assist in the distribution of local benevolence funds
- Serve as the staff liaison to Ekklesia and Martha's Mission

Administration

- Provide leadership alongside the appropriate committees on matters related to the maintenance of all church properties. (Including but not limited to committees such as: Building & Grounds, Transportation, Building and Growth)
- Supervise the Custodial Staff and Minister to Senior Adults by overseeing the work schedule, reviewing the work performed, and assigning other duties as needed.
- Oversee Upward Sports Ministries

• General Pastoral Responsibilities

- Participate in worship services, fill the pulpit in the pastor's absence, and conduct weddings and funeral services when requested.
- o Assist the pastor in hospital visitation, counseling, and crisis ministry.
- Serve on Church Council.
- Perform other duties as assigned by the Senior Pastor under the realm of church responsibilities.
